#### Nicholas Basbanes

Well known for writing about books and bibliophiles, Nicholas Basbanes has worked as an award-winning investigative reporter, a literary editor, and a nationally syndicated columnist.

Now in its eighth edition with more than 80,000 copies in print, his first book, A Gentle Madness: Bibliophiles, Bibliomanes, and the Eternal Passion for Books, was a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award in nonfiction for 1995, and was named a New York Times Notable Book of the Year.

Of his second book, Patience & Fortitude: A Roving Chronicle of Book People, Book Places, and Book Culture, two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer and historian David McCullough wrote that "Nicholas Basbanes has become our leading authority of books about books and this, his latest, is a jewel."

Basbanes's final volume in his trilogy for book lovers, A Splendor of Letters: The Permanence of Books in an Impermanent World, focuses on efforts to preserve books and other printed matter from the ravages of deterioration, destruction, obsolescence and the computer.



#### **Barry Moser**

Barry Moser is a consummate artist with experience in all phases of book design and production. His works are represented in many prestigious collections, including the Metropolitan Museum, the British Museum, Harvard, Princeton and the Library of Congress. In addition to being an illustrator he is also a printer, painter, printmaker, designer, author, essayist, and teacher, and frequently lectures and acts as visiting artist and artist in residence at universities and institutions across the country.

The books Moser has illustrated and/or designed form a list of over 250 titles, including the Arion Press Moby-Dick and the University of California Press The Divine Comedy of Dante. Moser's edition of Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland won the National Book Award for design and illustration in 1983 and prompted the poet John Ashbery, writing in Newsweek, to call Moser's work "never less than dazzling." His monumental work on the Pennyroyal Caxton Bible has been the subject of scores of articles in print, television, and radio as well as the subject of a documentary film called A Thief among the Angels.
